
## MASKS

# MY VISIT TO THE BROWARD CENTER



**I will be going to the Abdo New River Room at Broward Center to see a performance. I have tickets to watch:**



**When I get to the Broward Center, I will come from the parking garage across the street or I will be dropped off at the top of the hill at the Amaturo Theater.**

**There will be cars and people in line. It might get noisy too, but I will stay with my group and patiently wait for my turn to show the ticket.**




**Once I get to the box office, I and everyone in my group will show our tickets before going into the theater.**

**If I need help, I can ask an usher wearing a white shirt, red tie, and black pants. If I am lost, the usher can help me find my seat, restroom, or even my group.**



**Ushers**

**While sitting, there will be some space between me and other groups of people. I can walk around in the room if needed.**

**After I sit down in my seat, the lights will become dim, but there will still be enough light to see around the room. I have nothing to be scared about.**



**Before the show starts, someone will come on stage and make an announcement.**



**The show is fun! I can laugh, dance, and clap during the show while staying in my seat.**



**I can take a break at any time if I tell my parents or group. Then they will take me to the ABA Centers of Florida Sensory Quiet Room.**



**I will follow the signs to the ABA Centers of Florida Sensory quiet room. I can stay there until I am ready to go back to my seat and continue watching the show.**



**When the show gets too loud, I will use a pair of headphones that will make me feel more comfortable. I can also use a fidget toy while watching the show in my seat.**



**After the show ends, I will clap for the the actors to show that they did a good job.**



**When the show is over, I will follow instructions to meet with the actors. I may have to wait in line before I can take a picture with my group.**



**I can express “thank you” to the ushers and actors for making me and my group feel welcome.**
