BROWARD CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS HOSTS FOCUS BRAZIL

Business and cultural forum held May 4-7 has inspired annual events held in London and Japan and delivers an annual economic impact of \$10 million to Broward County

FORT LAUDERDALE – The Broward Center for the Performing Arts will host Focus Brazil from Wednesday, May 4 – Saturday, May 7 featuring panels with business leaders, musicians, educators and journalists before culminating in the Brazilian International Press Awards U.S.A. All panels will offer simultaneous translation.

More than 20,000 people have participated in the annual event since the press awards first were held at the Broward Center in 1997, followed by the inaugural business and cultural forum in 2005. More than one-third of those attending over the years came from 14 countries and 31 different U.S. States. The annual economic impact is estimated around to be \$10 million, spent on air travel, lodging, food, transportation and shopping.

"Brazil is Florida's top trading partner and a large Brazilian population contributes so much to South Florida's vibrant community and strong economy," said Broward Center President and CEO Kelley Shanley. "The Broward Center is proud to have been part of this energizing multi-cultural exchange of ideas between business and cultural leaders since its inception. Focus Brazil's impact is demonstrated by the fact it has inspired similar annual events in London and Japan."

The business panel on Thursday, May 5 will include a morning session with experts from the tri-county area: Manny Gonzalez, chief of economic development and international trade for the Miami-Dade County Regulatory and Economics Resource Department; Paola Isaac Baraya, an economic development specialist in international trade with the Broward County Office of Economic and Small Business Development; and Brian Cartland, vice president, business recruitment with the Business Development Board of Palm Beach County. The afternoon session, entitled "Brazil Beyond the Curve," will be moderated by Fernando Silva Pinto, international correspondent for *Rede Globo* in Washington, D.C.

In addition to business, the topics of this year's Focus Brazil include education, visual and performing arts, cultural activism, tourism, women's empowerment and the media. Participants include: musicians Roberto Menescal (the founder of Bossa Nova) and Jorge Ben Jor; journalists Gloria Maria, Marcia DeVito and Caco Barcelos; celebrated publicist Washington Olivetto; researchers and educators Sérgio Rego Monteiro and Albert Fishlow; world music expert Tom Gomes; and psychologist and motivational speaker Eliana Barbosa, among many others.

The Brazilian International Press Awards U.S.A. will take place on Saturday, May 7 at 7 p.m. in the Amaturo Theater. A highlight will be a concert by Brazilian singer-songwriter Guilherme Arantes.
