FUSHU DAIKO PRESENTS "SPIRIT DRUMMERS" AT THE BROWARD CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS

In addition to the performance, ensemble offers workshops to teach children, adults and families the art of Taiko drumming

FORT LAUDERDALE – South Florida's Taiko drum ensemble **Fushu Daiko** performs its new show, *Spirit Drummers*, in the Amaturo Theater at the Broward Center for the Performing Arts on **Friday**, **October 7 at 7:30 p.m.**

Spirit Drummers is inspired by the Japanese legend of the demon drummers of Nafune who used creative means to defend themselves from marauding Samurai in the 16th century. The score weaves original Fushu Daiko compositions with the traditional style and rhythms of the Noto area while the sounds of Japanese koto (harp) and shinobue (flute) add depth and beauty to the score.

Fushu Daiko's music combines the traditional drums and rhythms of Japan with musical styles from around the world, such as jazz and rhythm and blues, to create an exciting, powerful cross-cultural experience that strives to cross boundaries and connect cultures. The group is known for thrilling audiences with its thundering rhythms, dynamic movements, and intense showmanship.

Since 1990, Fushu Daiko has been training in the art of Taiko, a musical art form that builds on more than 2,600 years of tradition. Originally used only in holy shrines, Taiko later moved onto the battlefield and, today, is typically experienced in festival settings.

The event is presented by Japan Arts, Inc. as part of the Broward Center's Arts Access Program, which assists community-based organizations in presenting arts and cultural performances at the Broward Center. The program provides technical assistance and marketing support to local community groups enabling them to develop and build their audiences.
