BROWARD CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS OPENS HUIZENGA PAVILION

\$1M ENCORE! Challenge Announced

With fireworks, spotlights and the pop of champagne bottles, the Broward Center for the Performing Arts celebrated the grand opening of the Huizenga Pavilion with an evening of festivities that electrified the entertainment complex and transformed the Wendt Terraces along Fort Lauderdale's New River. The event, underwritten by Linda and Douglas Von Allmen, attracted more than 500 guests and featured a private performance by singer/songwriter Sheryl Crow.

The opening of the Huizenga Pavilion marked a major milestone in the Broward Center's \$56 million capital renewal and expansion project, *ENCORE! Building Community through the Arts.* The evening's dramatic moment came when Kelley Shanley, President and CEO of the Center, announced that an anonymous donor had offered to match, dollar-for-dollar, up to \$1 million in gifts to the campaign. He noted that the gifts must come within the next six weeks to be eligible for the one-to-one match.

"Since the launch of the *ENCORE!* capital campaign, generous donors and public partners have supported our efforts to restore our theaters, create new spaces and increase our capacity," said Shanley. "This commitment is yet another example of how deeply our community values the tremendous impact of the Broward Center."

To date, a total of \$54 million has been raised through public and private giving leaving a balance of \$2 million to meet the \$56 million campaign goal. Co-chairs of the *ENCORE!* capital campaign are Rose Miniaci, Charles L. Palmer, Bernard J. Peck, Ramón Rodríguez and Marti Huizenga, who played a pivotal role in the campaign both by being a lead contributor with Wayne Huizenga and by serving with energy, excitement and enthusiasm. CEO Shanley commended Marti Huizenga for her efforts just prior to Sheryl Crow's performance.

"This is truly your gift to the community," said Shanley. "As we have been taking in this beautiful facility in its great context on the river, it's so appropriate this new building is called the Huizenga Pavilion. Thank you, Marti."

The Huizenga Pavilion, a two-story structure with a glass facade overlooking the river, offers 3,500 square feet of event space in the Porter Riverview Ballroom on the second floor and, beginning in the fall, waterside dining at the New River Bistro on the first. Outside, the Wendt Terraces feature lovely views of the river, while the Von Allmen Plaza provides a grand entrance to all the offerings at the Broward Center.

Lisa Kitei, Executive Director of the Broward Performing Arts Foundation, thanked the underwriters and sponsors of the Grand Opening Celebration. "Their generous support allowed us to create an unforgettable evening to introduce these important additions to the Broward Center campus."

The next milestone in the *ENCORE!* project will be the opening of the Rose Miniaci Arts Education Center this summer. This new facility will feature the JM Family Studio Theater, a 2,100 square-foot education hall, as well as classrooms, coaching space and integrated technologies for distance learning. It will enable the Broward Center for the Performing Arts to reach even more children in its arts-in-education program, one of the largest in the United States now serving more than 150,000 students annually.
