The tour kicked off to sold-out shows in South Bend, Ind. with the Louisville Courier-Journal reporting, "Mellencamp had his share of fun — he's always been a consummate showman — but there was an underlying richness to his set that was far more impressive."

The North America tour is crisscrossing the nation for a total of 80 shows, hitting Mellencamp's hometown of Bloomington, as well as Chicago, Los Angeles, four nights in New York, and multiple dates across Canada. His final performance will be held in Indianapolis at the Bankers Life Fieldhouse on August 4th to benefit the Riley Children's Foundation, which supports Riley Hospital for Children.
