As an actor, Klein received a Tony Award nomination for Best Actor for his performance in the hit Neil Simon musical *They're Playing Our Song*. In 1993, he won an Obie and the Outer Critics Circle Award for Outstanding Performance by an Actor in Wendy Wasserstein's *The Sisters Rosensweig*.
