## SYMPHONY OF THE AMERICAS PRESENTS SUMMERFEST AT THE BROWARD CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS

**FORT LAUDERDALE – The Symphony of the Americas will present Summerfest**, its 25th anniversary summer music festival, in the Amaturo Theater at the Broward Center for the Performing Arts on Sunday, July 17 at 6 p.m.

Under the baton of Symphony Artistic Director, Maestro James Brooks-Bruzzese, this festival will highlight the "Best of the Best" performed by the Summerfest Chamber Orchestra, which features musicians and soloists who have participated in this Festival over the past 25 years.
